MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

2015 has been a banner year in building Village Improvement Project's capacity to operate at a super high credibility level. To summarize, VIP:

- Recruited skilled volunteers who built our brand, redesigned our website, improved our social media presence, designed a cook stove prototype, and created job descriptions and committee task sheets;
- Obtained an official address and phone number;
- Qualified as a member of GlobalGiving to crowdfund for our projects;
- Was accredited as an international NGO in Liberia;
- Provided 193 village families with solar lanterns; and
- Provided 12 town-limit signs for Suehn Highway

OUR STORY

VIP, Inc. joined GlobalGiving in July after a successful challenge campaign to raise \$5,000 from 40 donors. Through GlobalGiving, we raised over \$11,700 from 114 donors and were able to purchase an additional 160 solar lanterns for village families.

Pilot projects were implemented in June to supply 6 homes in a Liberian village with lanterns and to install 12 town limit signs along the Monrovia-Suehn Highway. GlobalGiving provided a seed grant to develop a feedback loop with village stakeholders. VIP field experts implemented a two-part feedback loop using tailored strategies. We consider our work a success because of the rich feedback from village responders and the wealth of information we garnered about their future needs.

As we move into 2016, VIP is prepared to launch its cook stove project, thanks to the volunteer support of a mechanical engineer in Columbus and a Ph.D. engineering student at The Ohio State University. Fundraising for this project will continue on GlobalGiving at goto.gg/22068.

Another venture we are embarking upon in 2016 is to partner with Clevrnet, a pro bono student consulting nonprofit out of Yale to enhance our capacity to implement our projects in Liberia.

To be the catalyst for unlocking the potential of village communities and to create viable solutions to improving village life using simple technologies in renewable energy.

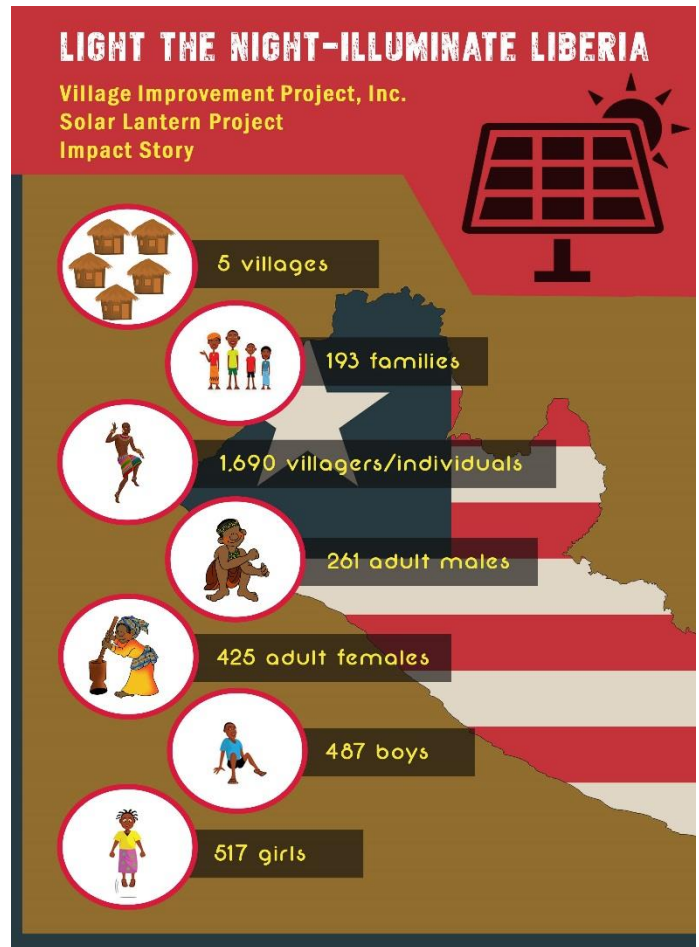


SOLAR LANTERN PROGRAM

Several villages in the Suehn Mecca District in Bomi County, Liberia received solar lights and road signs in local ceremonies on June 20, 2015. These ceremonies were attended by the Deputy Minister of Internal Affairs and Superintendents of Montserrado and Bomi Counties, along with district officials and members of the news media.

By January 2016, another 187 families received solar lanterns.

As a part of VIP's feedback loop, each village with solar lanterns will receive a mobile phone for communication with VIP staff about any issues with using the lanterns. We will provide training for use and maintenance of lanterns through the first year of use. As a result of this feedback loop, three lanterns in the pilot project have been repaired and put back in service.



Solar Lantern Impact Story

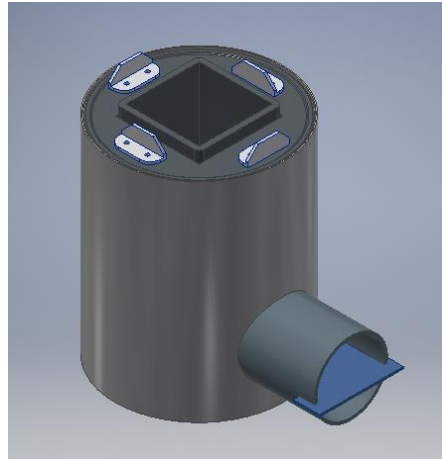


COOKING STOVE PROGRAM

Use of rocket stove technology in villages will help address the high demand for biomass fuels and to reduce household air pollution caused by using traditional cooking methods.

- Fuel gathering consumes considerable time for women and children, limiting other productive activities and taking children away from school.
- Non-renewable harvesting of biomass contributes to deforestation and thus climate change.

VIP's design team of mechanical engineers has begun work and by early 2016, the first prototype will be available for field testing in Liberia.

VISIBILITY FOR RURAL LIBERIA

The first 12 town-limit signs are installed and we've conducted a feedback survey from residents and motorists on the Suehn Highway about the usefulness of the signs. A typical response was voiced by a Boombula villager who said, "The road sign is helping travelers visiting our village to find their way easily."

Geographic identification will enable timely delivery of healthcare services, construction supplies, educational materials, government assistance of various kinds, trade and retail activities, and engender a sense of pride within the community.

We will use feedback from this project to help us better understand what drives sustained adoption of clean energy and safe travel. Specifically, we want first to know if the lanterns and road signs are useful and, secondly, if there are other resources that are needed.
